- In collaboration with diverse stakeholders and partners, DCTA is a leader in advancing mobility initiatives to serve the everchanging transit needs of riders.



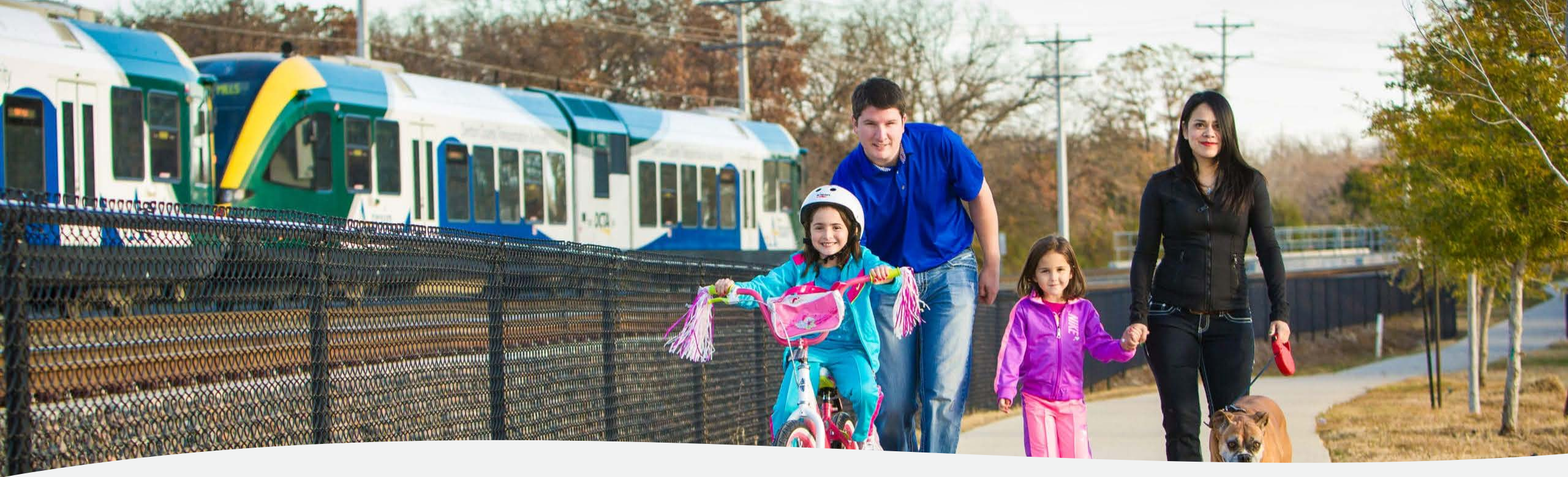
Bike Friendly Transportation

- DCTA accommodates bicycles on transit vehicles whenever possible
- Passengers can use bike racks on the front many DCTA buses, take them on buses not equipped with exterior racks and use the bike hooks onboard the A-train
- Bike racks are available at all A-train stations
- DCTA hosts a detailed web page for bike resources and participates in community bike events



DCTA Rail Trail

- The A-train Rail Trail runs alongside DCTA's commuter rail line and was designed to complement its surroundings and adjacent facilities
- The 19-mile trail is part of the agency's ongoing efforts to provide safe, customer-focused and efficient mobility solutions to Denton County
- It connects existing transit facilities with key destinations within DCTA's member cities and surrounding areas



Rail Trail Amenities

- The trail provides rest areas that include trash cans
- Community enhancements for landscaping and benches
- Z crossing fencing for safety to get cyclists to dismount, look both ways and walk their bikes across the rail tracks
- DCTA plans to install reflective surfaces on the fencing to help with visibility
